From the Principal

Dear Parents

School reports

On Friday 23 June school reports will be issued for the first half of the year. Once you have looked through your child's report, please talk to them about their learning goal for the second half of the year. Please note that the A to E grading is a legislative requirement of the Government, not something St Michael's have implemented on their own. Please focus on what your child has learnt and the next step in their learning. Every parent wants the best for their child however it is important that we recognise that children develop at different rates. Our children have to feel valued for their effort and then their achievement.

Please note that the A, B, C, D, E grading system does not imply the traditional grades that we may have experienced at school. You may like to equate the grading to gaining a driving licence.

E means that you're on your L's. You have an **elementary** understanding of the road rules and driving. You're still learning and need to have the instructor, Teacher present in order to complete work.

D means that you have your P's. You're no longer a learner. You have a **basic** knowledge of the road rules and driving. You can drive unassisted but you're still gaining experience. You can't drive to the speeds that a 'black-licenced' driver can yet.

C means that you have obtained your 'black-licence'. You know all the rules and can drive wherever you like. You've got a **sound** knowledge of all the road rules and how to drive successfully.

B means that you have your 'black-licence' and have completed a defensive driver's course. You have skills and a **high** knowledge that few other drivers have.

A means that you have your 'black-licence' and have completed an Advanced driver course. You have **excellent** skills and knowledge that **very few** other drivers have.

Reflection

There is a Buddhist saying that has two parts to it: "If you want to know your past, look into your present conditions." We are the product of our past actions and decisions. "If you want to know your future, look into your present actions." This time, our future is in our hands, and in our hands, also, is the future of our children, for they are just starting to build the lives in which they will live and they need our hands to be guiding hands.

The Old Testament's Book of Proverbs allows us to share advice that was given more than two and a half thousand years ago: "Train a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not turn from it." (Prov. 22:6)

However, before we can do that we need to ensure that we have a positive attitude towards ourselves that is supported by rewarding interests so that our children don't have to compensate us for having a disappointing life. We need to clearly identify any unfulfilled wishes in our own lives, so that we don't, unconsciously, expect our children to fulfil them for us and not lead their own lives.

Bestselling author, Stephanie Dowrick, has these wise offerings to share:

- "Keep in mind that your children are separate children, still dependent and beloved. They are not you, you are not them.
- Remember that you are a parent not a coach. A coach praises unconditionally; a parent loves unconditionally.
- Be pleased for them when things go well; be confident in them when things don't go so well.
- Value simple pleasures, easy sharing, quiet talks, lots of affection, play and laughter.
- Consider what you enjoy most about being a parent; do more of that." (from *Choosing Happiness*)

As Christian parents, there is nothing as meaningful or motivating in life as being "used" by God to communicate His love, care and forgiveness to our children by our guiding hands. Of all the kindness we might confer on our children, perhaps the greatest is to lead them to realise their potential for goodness and then to live it.

"Dear Lord, We ask You to strengthen us in our role as parents. Help us to be positive, encouraging, appreciative and supportive of each other as we guide our children's lives to reflect Your goodness and love. Amen."

Early collection of children from school

If there is a need to collect your child early from school for an unavoidable appointment, please send a note to the classroom teacher in the morning and proceed to the school office when you arrive.

On your arrival at the school office, staff will contact the class teacher and your child will then meet you at the school office. While you are waiting for your child, you will be asked to sign them out of the school.

Parents are not permitted to go directly to classrooms or other areas to collect their children.

Please allow plenty of time as it will take a few minutes to contact your child, have them pack their bag and walk to the school office.

Recess is from 11.00—11.30 am and Lunch is from 1.00—1.40 pm.

If you are collecting your child/ren around Recess or Lunch, we suggest you arrive at the school prior to or after the Recess/Lunch times as you may have to wait until your child returns from the oval after Recess/Lunch.

Please note that no child is allowed to go home with another parent unless there is written permission prior to their departure from the school.

Children leaving school at 3.10 pm

A number of children are coming to the school office to find out how they are getting home each day.

Please ensure your child knows how they are going home every day.

Could you please discuss these arrangements with your child and write it in their diary. This daily organisation will save your child from becoming distressed at school.

If there is an unavoidable change to how they are going home, we would ask that you contact the office before 1 pm so the message can be passed on to your child.

Every effort is made to get this message to your child's teacher in the recess and lunch breaks so that the children's learning sessions are not disrupted by unnecessary phone calls.

Student Absence—Taking leave from school

On Friday 4 August, all schools will participate in the compulsory government School Census. Every student needs to be accounted for on this day.

We take this opportunity to revise the procedure for taking leave during the year.

Requirements for student absence and travel

- **1-4 days absence:** Parents **must** notify the school principal by mail or email (written).
- **5 or more days absence:** Parents must complete and submit the *Application for Extended Leave* form (**A1**) prior to commencing leave. If approved the Principal issues a *Certificate of Extended Leave* (**C1**). If the principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

Exemption from attendance

This relates to students who wish to participate in an accredited Elite Sports Program/Elite Arts Program, Employment in the Entertainment Industry or where there are exceptional circumstances.

For additional information on accredited Elite Sport Program and Elite Arts program, contact the school office.

Please note: If your child is representing St Michael's at a school organised sporting event, their absence is classed as school business.

Enrolment Policy

St Michael's, a Catholic parish primary school in the diocese of Parramatta aims to provide an education for children from Kindergarten to Year 6 in a climate humanly and spiritually rich. St Michael's community recognises that it finds its true justification in the mission of church; it is based on an educational philosophy in which feature, culture and life are brought into harmony. This enrolment policy adheres to the guidelines of Parramatta Catholic Systemic Schools.

Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Enrolment Policy

Catholic families can apply for enrolment in a Catholic school anywhere in the Diocese.

Where places are limited, priority will be given in order to:

- Catholic children who live in the local parish
- Catholic children from other parishes
- Children of families who actively participate in the life of the school and local parish community (e.g. siblings)
- Orthodox children
- Children from other Christian faiths
- Children of non-Christian faiths

Frequently Asked Questions:

Who makes decisions regarding enrolment of students?

The principal of each school has the delegated authority to accept enrolments. The Principal must consult with the Parish Priest and Catholic Education's Director of System Performance to ensure the enrolment policy and procedures are given effect.

How is enrolment determined?

The principal determines if the student meets regular enrolment criteria by:

- a) conducting enrolment interviews as necessary in consultation with the parish priest
- b) reviewing all enrolment applications using the CEDP enrolment process

Will siblings of children already enrolled have preference?

Siblings of children already enrolled in the school are considered by the same criteria above. However, within each of these categories, a sibling of a child already enrolled will have preference over an applicant who does not have a sibling enrolled in the school.

Is enrolment guaranteed for existing primary students?

A child who has completed primary education in a Catholic Diocesan primary school will *usually* be offered continuity of enrolment in a Catholic Diocesan secondary school. If no places exist at the school of choice, contact Catholic Education's Director of System Performance to assist the family to enrol in another Catholic secondary school in the Diocese. Photographs taken at school

From time to time photographs may be taken of your child whilst they are at school. These photos may be used in school Newsletters, publications and the school website. They may also be used by Catholic Education, Parramatta Diocese in their publications and website.

If you do not wish your child's photo to be taken, please notify the school in writing or request a new consent form.

If you wish to change consent for raffle tickets to be sent home, please notify the school in writing or request a new consent form.
