# From the Principal

**Dear Parents**

#### Term 4

**Welcome back to Term 4.** It was wonderful to see our students return to school with enthusiasm and interest in their learning. Only a few reluctant ones, some nerves, which is not uncommon. I am sure with the help of your positive reassurance those butterflies in the tummy will soon settle. If there are any issues please speak to your child's teacher. We are all looking forward to having a happy, successful and productive term.

**Congratulations** to the students who continue to wear their uniform with pride. Please support the school by sending your child to school in their complete summer uniform or sports uniform. If at any time there is an issue with part of their uniform, please send them to school in the uniform that is complete.

#### Daily attendance

**Every day counts.** It is important for your child's wellbeing and academic progress that they attend school regularly and complete each school day. Children need to attend school every day from 8.45 am until 3.10 pm unless illness prevents their attendance. Please ensure that appointments are made outside of school hours in order to ensure that your child can maximise their learning potential. Learning takes place from 8.45 am until the final bell at 3.10 pm. Being late or taking your child early from school, particularly on a regular basis, may hinder their personal and academic progress. This is often reflected in school reports.

Parents taking their children out of school on a regular basis will be contacted by the Principal. Should you need to take your child out of school early on an unavoidable occasion, a note should be sent in to the class teacher. This will minimise the interruption to learning time for all students. Please avoid disruption to teachers and students by arriving unexpectedly to pick up children without prior notice.

#### Term 4 Slow & Go Changes

From Monday 9 October Slow & Go resumed on the school grounds. The procedure is the same as we have always used—numbers are called and children are directed to their parent's cars.

Parents, please be aware that there are pedestrians also using this area. Parents who are coming to collect their children after 3.15 pm will have to come down to the Slow & Go area as no child will be left on the main playground.

Parents who are walking to collect their children from Slow & Go are asked to enter and leave the school grounds via the walkway access and stairs that lead to the School office, proceed down the stairs near the Library and walk across underneath the covered awning near the canteen. This walkway will soon be painted with a pedestrian crossing. Please do not enter or exit the double gates or small gate; cars are driving through between 3.20-3.40 pm.

We ask all drivers to be aware of pedestrians. Pedestrians have right of way at all times.

#### Reflection

There are two ways to look at life, positively or negatively. The choice is ours and there always is a choice provided we take charge of our attitude and don't permit someone else to choose it for us. Do we provide for them the "triple goodies" of good nutrition, good sleep, good exercise? Do we encourage them to focus on the "good thing" they have in life and to be content?

Samuel Johnston reminds us that, "Our attitude is the expression of our values, our beliefs and our expectations." How is our attitude perceived by our children? It is important for our children to realise that no matter how hard they try to develop positive attitudes, they don't live in a vacuum. They will surely come across people who have an unenlightened view on life. However, it doesn't matter what kind of attitude other people resent to them, what matters is how they deal with it and how they perceive its worth. Hopefully, they will have us to look up to for their models for positive living.

Blessing: "May you rise each day with a voice of blessing whispering in your heart, that something good is going to happen to you. May you find harmony between your soul and your life. May there by kindness in your gaze when you look within. May the presence of the Almighty be forever in you. Amen"

#### Classes for 2018

If you believe your child has any of the above needs which should be considered for their placement in a class for 2018, please put this information into a letter to the Principal. This is not an invitation for you to nominate your child's teacher. It is however, an opportunity to highlight any special needs that will help the teachers form class groups for 2018.

Teachers will also provide the children with an opportunity to nominate 2 or 3 friends that they would like to be with in 2018. The school will endeavour to have at least one of their friends progress with them if this is in your child's best interest. Towards the end of term 4 the children will have the opportunity to meet their 2018 teacher together with their new classmates.

Parents and their daughters have the opportunity to tour the school campus at one of our upcoming school tours specifically for Year 7 2019 applicants, but open to any year group.



#### ST MICHAEL'S BAULKHAM HILLS - ALLERGY AWARENESS

Throughout our school we have a number of children with **life threatening allergies** (Anaphylaxis) to various forms of food, latex, dust, cats and insect stings. This is a serious matter, one that our school must address.

Some children have allergies that are so severe that smells or touch could trigger a reaction.

In order to do this we appeal to all parents to assist us in caring for these children by considering the type of foods you pack for your own child's recess and lunch.

Our aim is to minimise the amount of peanut and tree nut products brought into the school. These foods are extremely dangerous to our children with allergies and cause 50% of food allergic deaths.

Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask you to refrain from sending them to school and to seek suitable alternatives.

#### The Canteen does not sell any of these products.

In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

There are many foods that DO NOT contain peanuts or nuts in their ingredients list, but the food package has the statement. "May contain traces of dairy, nut or seed". This food may be brought to school and consumed only by non-allergic children.

Due to safety and concerns, we discourage children from sharing food and drink. We would also appreciate parents speaking to their children regarding this matter. Your child's diet at home need not change.

Below is a list of foods that are safe for you to choose from. We're sure you can think of many others.

- Fruit and vegetables
- Dried fruits, Fruit snack packs
- Vegemite, jam, honey, cheese spreads
- Parker's Pretzels, Rice crackers
- Chips, Popcorn
- Plain biscuits sweet or savoury without nuts
- Chocolate biscuits without nuts
- Plain Cornflakes, Rice Bubbles, Weetbix, etc without nuts
- Fruit based muesli bars and snack bars without nuts
- Yoghurt without nuts mixes
- Lollies and confectionary items marshmallow, spearmint leaves, jelly babies, snakes, raspberries, etc without nuts.

Basically we ask you not to send food to school with your child that contains a nut or nut product listed in ingredients. We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all children at St Michael's.
