St Michael's Christmas Story—Friday 15 December at 12 noon in the Church

MAI—Maths Assessment Interviews

This interview will give us the data that will ensure our students can be successful learners given time and the opportunities to engage in high quality Mathematics programs. Reflection

"Christmas is almost here!" So what do we think of when we hear such news? Probably, the thoughts that come to mind, are those associated with the necessary preparations that go to make the day an enjoyable occasion marked by lots of food, presents, lights and tinsel. Besides this type of joy there is another:

"Let's arise with joy in our hearts and share it with everyone.

The meaning of Christmas will always be the birth of Jesus, God's Son." Author uncertain

Christmas is an anniversary celebration of when God gave us the gift of Himself without splendour or opulence but in poverty and weakness, in the form of a tiny baby in an animal enclosure. Jesus, Son of God, emptied himself of power, privilege and possessions and was born into the human race in the humblest of manner.

In the early years of the Church, Christianity grew and spread very quickly. This was because Christians were known for their unusual compassion for those around them—so different to the treatment metered out by the Romans. The first Christians knew that God, taking flesh in Jesus for the sake of the whole world, wasn't an event of the past; it was the pattern for their own lives every day. People in any age of anxiety and oppression were attracted to a religion whose adherents dared not to follow the culture of the day but to transform it.

The goodness of a Christian, one who models life on Christ, is not a matter of achieving a high moral standard or of scoring high marks in a test of "rules-observance". It is letting the wonder of God's love come through our lives and allowing it to be available to other people. Love is given so that love can be born in another and given in return.

- **The Kindy 2017 category will be deleted on Monday 29 January.**
- **"BUS"** category—if your child catches the bus, please include this category for information on late running bus alerts.
- **"Kindy 2018"** category for alerts related to Kindergarten children commencing in 2018.

Please book an assessment time for your child with the **2018 class teacher**. There are only a limited number of bookings on these days, so if you are not available or there are no interview times left, the class teacher will organise the assessment in the first two weeks of the 2018 school year.

2018 Kindergarten parents will receive a separate letter with a different booking code informing them of which teacher to book the interview with.

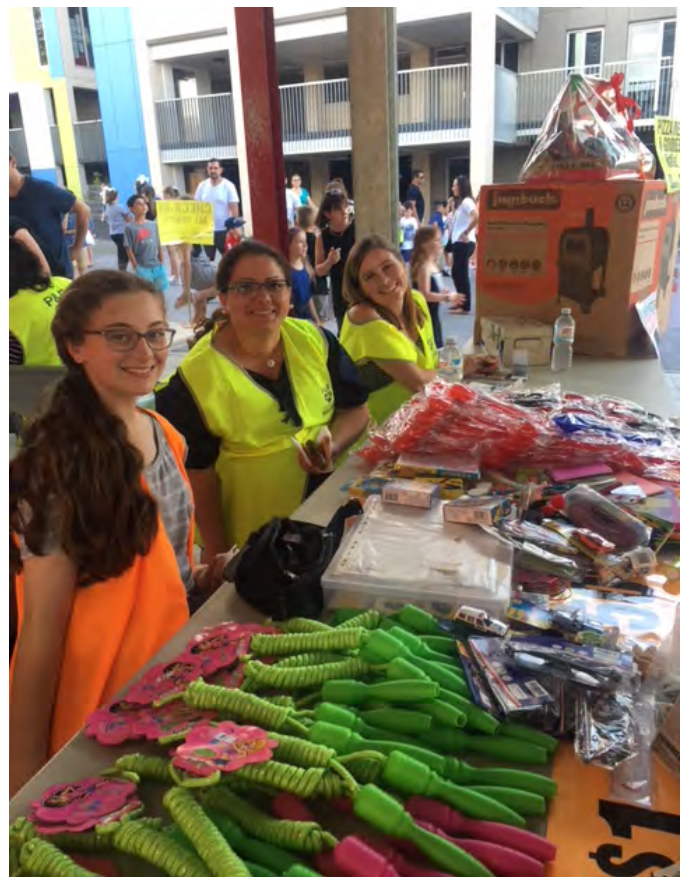
