Feast of the Ascension of our Lord—Thursday 25 May

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord. Jesus' message to His disciples was very clear and challenging...

"Go out to the world and proclaim the good news to all creation to share his love and teachings."

Jesus knew how sad and afraid His disciples would feel, but He told them He would be with them always through the power of the Holy Spirit and through the sharing of bread and wine during Eucharist,

The Feast of the Ascension is a reminder of what we are called to do – to bring Jesus' good news of hope to others. Just like what happened to the disciples in Sunday's Gospel. Matthew tells us that the eleven men who worshipped Jesus were commissioned by him to go out to the world and they were promised that he would stay with them until the end of time.

Whether we realise it or not we are commissioned to go out to the world at the end of every liturgy, 'Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.' We are not here just for ourselves. Mass, which comes from a word meaning 'to be sent', indicates that our liturgy is about celebrating what God has done in the world in and through us, and is a preparation for what God still wants to accomplish.

Finally, we continue to experience the abiding presence of Christ in our daily lives or else we wouldn't be here. God, as revealed in Jesus Christ, is not distant to our lives or impervious to our needs; we believe in a Companion-God who seeks our company as much as we need his.

So, Jesus' message and mass each week is very relevant to all of us ~ What is the good news we proclaim? What message do others receive from the way we act and the words we use? Do our actions and words . . . **challenge, inspire, energise** and **support** those around us?

Afternoons: Parish car park/Slow & Go

We have been alerted to parents putting themselves and others at risk in the afternoons by driving around cars in the slow and go queue on Chapel Lane over double yellow lines and then trying to turn into the Church Car park beside cars already in the entry lane to the carpark. Please do not do this.

This is extremely dangerous as there is only enough room for one car to go in and one car to come out of the carpark at any time. Pedestrians are also using this area and priority must be given to pedestrians crossing and using this area.

Please wait in the Slow & Go line until you can safely enter the car park.

Thank you for your support in ensuring that your children remain safe at all times.

School pedestrian crossing

Please do not stop to drop your child off at the pedestrian crossing in the mornings or arrange to stop and pick them up at the pedestrian crossing in the afternoon. This places your child at risk as well as hindering the traffic flow in this area.

NSW Road Safety Plan 2021: Community and Stakeholder Engagement

A new road safety plan for NSW is being developed this year to ensure effective actions are in place to meet the Road Safety Strategy 2012-2021 targets for reducing deaths and serious injuries on NSW roads.

The Road Safety Plan 2021 will also position NSW to achieve the longer term target of a zero road toll to support the Future Transport strategy which is being developed this year to establish a 40-year vision for transport in NSW to meet the long-term needs of transport customers.

Safety is a shared responsibility and so input from communities and stakeholders across NSW is critical for developing effective measures to reduce road trauma.

Development of the Road Safety Plan 2021 will draw on:

- An examination of crash information to understand the factors involved in the crashes in NSW.
- Evidence from Australia and worldwide about what has been proven to be effective in saving lives and reducing serious injuries.
- Feedback from stakeholders and the NSW community through a statewide consultation program.

Children arriving late to school Partial absences

Children who arrive late to school after the first bell are required to go to the school office to sign in and collect a late pass. **Parents are required to sign their child in and provide a reason.** When children arrive late without a parent to sign them in they are marked as an unexplained partial absence.

We understand that there may be unforeseen circumstances from time to time where your child may be late but there are some children who are late on a regular basis. There is a huge impact on children coming to school late all the time, not just for the child's own learning - it is also disruptive to the other children in the class, particularly if a teacher has to explain the work already commenced. Please ensure that your child is ready to start the school day on time so they can maximise their learning.

Photographs taken at school

From time to time photographs may be taken of your child whilst they are at school or at events that your child is attending while on school business, ie choir / band / sport. These photos may be used in school Newsletters, publications and the school website. They may also be used by Catholic Education, Parramatta Diocese in their publications and website.

If you do not wish your child's photo to be taken, please put this in writing and address to the Principal, Mrs Maka.

Medication

If it is necessary for your child to take medication during the school day, the medication together with a medication note needs to be left at the office on the child's arrival at school. For safety reasons, medication is not to be self-administered or kept in your child's bag.

If possible, it is preferable for a medication form from the office to be completed. This is available on our website or from the school office. The Office Staff will assist children in taking their medication.

The medication note needs to include the following information:

- Child's name and class
- Doctor who has prescribed the medication
- Medication name, dosage and time of dosage




