Dear Parents

Pride

Grit and our motivation are building blocks to success, yet we sometimes struggle with how to instil these qualities in children.

A study last year by German researchers found students who reported feeling positive emotions such as pride and enjoyment in their work had significantly better achievement over time than students who had the same level of ability but fewer positive emotions.

On the other hand, feeling a lack of pride in our work can motivate us to work harder, too.

Parents play a critical role in building their child's sense of pride. Our brains don't come hard-wired to know what to take pride in, such as grades or sports, so children initially look to parents and then to teachers and peers to find out what's valued by those around them and therefore what goals are worthwhile to pursue.

When young people are engaged in areas where they feel confident and proud, it creates a ripple effect, giving them the motivation and encouragement to take on new challenges in other areas of their lives. To teach children how to use pride as a motivational tool, point it out: Did you notice how you felt when you aced your assessment, built that lego model or sang that song?

To stay intrinsically motivated, children must feel as if they're improving toward a goal, so point out the pride they should feel in the small successes along the way.

When we withhold genuine praise or downplay pride, we deprive children of a powerful source of motivation that can help them persevere in the face of challenges today - and throughout their lives.

Yesterday was the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As a school community we celebrated the feast day by attending Mass.

"Mary, A young Galilean woman betrothed to be married. Visited by the angel Gabriel, a messenger from God. Asked to bear the Son of God, the Most High. Understandably shocked. Mary's faith in the Lord was so strong that she answered "yes" to God, Though she was perplexed and afraid. May we also be unwavering in our faith and answer "yes" when we hear God's call. Amen."

Attendance

Our school attendance rate is currently 86.5%. Our school goal for the whole year is 90%.

The reason we track school attendance is because research shows us there is a strong correlation between school attendance and achievement. The school will contact you if we are concerned about your child's attendance. We are here to listen and support you to help your child have great patterns of attendance.

Congratulations to Kindergarten & Year 1 for achieving our goal of 90% for attendance.

NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test

2018

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Planning has begun to move NAPLAN from a pen and paper assessment to an online assessment in 2019.

This term in Week 6 Monday 27-Thursday 30 August our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be participating in a NAPLAN online school readiness test.

The school readiness test is a combined literacy/numeracy assessment and Year 5 will also undertake an online writing assessment. This readiness test is not a test of the individual children's academic performance but a 'test of school readiness' - that is, to enhance test administrators' familiarity with the online assessment platform.

Therefore parents and schools will not receive individual student performance results.

Please note all students in Years 3 and 5 will require their own bud earphones for the school readiness test.



How the Gift Stall works:

- 4. To make sure your child doesn't miss out, please make sure each of your children is on a separate slip.
- 5. If you have two or more children, money and slips can go into the one envelope.
- 6. No need to separate as long as each child has their own slip in that one envelope
