Father's Day

Happy Father's Day to all our fathers, grandfathers and great grandfathers this Sunday 2 September.

On Friday 31 August we will celebrate Father's Day with a whole school Non-Eucharistic Liturgy in the Church at 10.15 am. The P&F will provide a BBQ Breakfast from 7.30 am—9.00 am near the Hall. Fathers will be able to go to their children's classroom for reading from 9.00 am—9.45 am.

On this day we will also be supporting Jersey Day. The children can wear their favourite sports jersey with their sports uniform.

Families

Our family is the first school for our children and we parents are powerful models. Being a parent is one of humankind's most difficult tasks. Of course, there are many pleasures and rewards but parenting can be demanding, challenging, exhausting—and there's no time off.

What makes it challenging and demanding is that every day we act as a model for our children. Every day they are watching and learning from us; they learn from our actions and conversations, they absorb our attitudes and copy our expressions. They are doing this mostly without us being aware that it is taking place.

Because we are the main caregivers, we provide the major influence on our children's lives. We constantly demand respect from our children but it is not something that we should take for granted. Like most things of real value, respect has to be earned. The best way for us to earn respect is to give respect.

Our children, want to see us express real feelings in a healthy way, they want to see us handle anger in an appropriate way, they like to see us making healthy choices about our lifestyle, they like to hear us speaking positively about other people, they like to observe us showing respect when it comes to alcohol, prescription drugs and gambling. They like to witness positive reinforcements as to how they would like their life to be.

Our decisions will not always be perfect; however, if we can continue to reflect on our lives and take opportunities to continue to grow and develop our skills this will build on the positive impact we can have with our children.

1-2-3 Magic & Emotion Coaching Parent Course

During Weeks 7-9 the 1-2-3 Magic and Emotion Coaching program will take place at the school starting on Wednesday evening 12 September from 6-8 pm. The course will be run by presenters from the Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta.

The 1-2-3 Magic and Emotion Coaching program aims to teach parents how to deal with their children's difficult behaviour by using an easy-to-learn and easy-to-use signalling system to manage children's difficult behaviour. The signalling system requires the parent to use less talk and less emotion, which in turn encourages the development of children's ability to manage their emotional reactions to parental boundaries (or emotional competency).

The 1-2-3 Magic and Emotion Coaching program will run for three weeks as follows:

Session 1: Wednesday 12 September - 6-8 pm; Session 2: Wednesday 19 September - 6-8 pm; Session 3: Wednesday 26 September - 6-8 pm

Weeks 6 & 7: Being a good winner. Being a good loser.


- Winning feels good, but remember to win in a way which keeps friends.

Science Week Paper Plane Challenge!!!

During the last two weeks, we have taken part in the New South Wales Paper Plane Challenge! All classes designed and made their paper aeroplanes, which they then tested for 1) the longest distance flown and 2) the longest time to be in the air (airtime).

We were learning to design and make a plane that would beat the current New South Wales age appropriate records. We had to think about how the plane moved through the air, what made it more aerodynamic and what helped it to be pushed by the air in order to keep it in the air for the longest airtime. We soon learned that the paper planes needed to be designed differently for each type of challenge.

The person to reach the longest distance throw for each grade was awarded with a prize in Assembly last week. All students who met their grade record for New South Wales were invited to go to the State Championships, which were held last Saturday at Sydney University. Several students attended.

News from Year 3

Book Parade and Author and Illustrator Visit – Frane Lessac

Last Thursday, Frane Lessac visited Year 3 during *Book Week*. The students were very interested to learn about Frane's life as an Author and Illustrator. Here are some highlights of the week from the students.



"Frane talked to us and said when you are doing artwork, concentrate and sit in a quiet place. I learnt about *Midnight*. She had a star on her head and was born under a tree. She tried to get water but they had to jump over a trench of soldiers. They jumped and they didn't make it. They were shot. The horse died but the man survived." *Watson*

"What I liked about the book parade was that I got to see many cool costumes. For example *Demon Dentist* and Spencer dressed up as Ben from *Gangsta Granny*. I dressed up as Rhydian from *Wolf Blood*." Ashton

"Frane talked about her first book called *My Little Island*. She got her ideas from going to places around the world. She went to Gallipoli and wrote the book *Simpson and his Donkey.*" *Jason*

"The parade was fun. I saw lots of different book characters. I saw Sherlock Holmes, Optimus Prime, a pirate ship and a treehouse." *Alexander*

"I dressed up as Ganger from *Pokemon*. I learnt how Frane got inspired to make her books. I learnt her books are fiction and she sometimes works with other authors. I went up on stage with the whole class." *Dominic*

"Frane loves to write and illustrate books.

She wrote and illustrated A is for Australian Animals and Under the Southern Cross.





Frane illustrated some books such as *Midnight, Simpson and his Donkey* and *Moondyne Joe*, which were written by her husband Mark Greenwood. Frane loves to travel to places to write books and get ideas. Frane has a special paint. She gets a crayon and draws on the page. Then she gets a paint brush and wets the page with water. Then it becomes paint." *Nathan*

"Last week we got to meet an author and illustrator. Her name is Frane Lessac. Frane travelled to a lot of different places to get information for her books. Some of the books she has illustrated are *Midnight*, *Simpson and his Donkey* and *Moondyne Joe*. The author of these books is Mark Greenwood. Some of the books Frane wrote and illustrated are A *is for Australian Animals* and *Under the Southern Cross* which will probably come out next month. Frane has a place where she writes and illustrates her books.

She has special brushes that she uses for her different paintings. Frane does a lot of planning and it takes her a long time to finish her books. Frane has an editor to help her edit her books." *Yohan*

"On Thursday Frane Lessac visited our school and we got to meet her. She told us about her books. Some of the books she has written and illustrated and some, she has just illustrated. Two books she wrote and illustrated were *A is for Australian Animals* and *Under the Southern Cross.*" *Jacob*

Fruit & Veg Month is a health promotion program for NSW primary schools that puts a positive focus on fruit and vegetables.




