From the Principal

Dear Parents

Congratulations—What a great way to start the year.

We have had two whole school gatherings, our Welcoming Mass and Ash Wednesday liturgy. I would like to say congratulations to all our students for their prayerfulness and their engagement in both these liturgies. What a beautiful way to start our year together as a faith filled community.

Teddy Bear's Picnic

Thank you to Mrs Lee and the P&F for the wonderful opportunity our Kindergarten children and their families had to join us for the Teddy Bear's Picnic. It was a real joy to see so many of our families accept this invitation and begin their journey with us and get to know the other families and children who will also be on the journey at St Michael's with their child.

The P&F are to be congratulated for their organisation and commitment to making this a fun and relaxed day. Our special thanks also to Mrs Lee who coordinated the day's events and involved our Year 6 student leaders. Thank you to our student leaders, and their families for allowing your child to support Kindergarten with this event. Thank you also to our teachers who attended on the day and were able to meet and greet so many of our families.

Parish car park and neighbourhood driveways

We received a letter from a parent who experience an unfortunate incident in the Parish car park where a mother, who was blocking traffic and requested to move, was rude and made inappropriate gestures in front of children and family members.

'The school does a wonderful job of instilling certain values in our children and to have witnessed such deplorable behaviour from a mother no less is a disappointment far greater than the lack of spatial awareness and total disregard for every other parent who does the right thing when picking up their child from school.' Please show respect to our children, families, neighbours and staff at all times. With the high volume of traffic in the neighbouring streets and parish car park, we would ask our parents to please move carefully in these areas, follow all of the guidelines we have in place and the road rules and show respect to everyone.

<u>Ash Wednesday</u>

Yesterday we entered the season of Lent. We began the season with the ritual of ashes. God moulded the human body from the dust of the red earth. But we are more than dust, for God breathed into this dust his breath, the breath of life, his Spirit. When we die and return to dust, our life-breath returns to God. We pray that God will breathe his life into us again, as he did to Jesus, and draw us into the embrace of eternal life.

We do not begin Lent by focusing negatively on ourselves. We begin where Jesus began: 'The Kingdom of god is at hand, so repent!' We pray that God will pour his Spirit into our hearts, to renew us with the fire of his Spirit.

Fasting has been a traditional way of reminding ourselves to go without certain external pleasures so that we can create some space in which to feel our hunger and thirst for God.

Jesus in the gospel also invites us not only to fast but also to turn our attention in a special way to the needs of our neighbour and to spend time in prayer. The question we might ask ourselves as Lent begins is: What is God gracing me to change? Where is God's love calling me to grow? God loves us with an everlasting love and he will certainly be offering us the grace today, and throughout lent, to find the courage to let him purify our hearts.

Do not sit in silence and watch Jesus walk by. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, let us invite him now into our hearts. Let our main resolution for Lent be to make space in our day to be alone with God—giving him this time in order that he may love us with his Spirit.

'Ever-renewing Spirit of God, You lead us again into the Lenten wilderness. Reshape our hearts in this holy place: unbind our complacency and form us into a faithful people, attuned to Your Word and the cries of our sisters and brothers. We ask this in hope, as followers of Christ, awaiting his promise. Amen.'

Parish car park

There are serious concerns about the behaviour of some of our parents when using the car park.

Please do not park on the roundabout in the car park or on the yellow pedestrian lines. Parking in these areas puts our children at risk and families in danger and causes congestion.

The **disabled car space** is for parents who have disabled children in the school and who have the permission of the Principal to use this space. If you are parking in this space without permission you are causing considerable distress to the children who need to use this space.

There is also **no parking in front of the gates** at the bottom of the car park or beside the **two admin spaces** from 7.00 am to 4.30 pm.

Please be respectful and considerate of our children, families and staff at all times, and particularly if you are asked to move your vehicle.

It is important that we show respect and model appropriate behaviour to our children.

Neighbourhood driveways

Some of our neighbours have complained that parents are not leaving driveways free for cars to enter and exit their homes, entering driveways to drop off children and then reversing out, and also driving through circular driveways and out the other side.

Please be respectful and considerate of our neighbours. As you drive up Chapel Lane, please make sure that you are safety conscious and do not stop in neighbours' driveways to let your children out. It is a very dangerous practice in such a high volume area particularly where there is limited visibility on bends and on the crests of hills.

Canteen ordering

The canteen is fully operational and can take online orders or you can order via cash by sending in a lunch bag and money sent in with your child. Full details of the ordering system and canteen menu are available on our website and from the school office.

The canteen offers a wonderful array of freshly cooked meals for breakfast, recess and lunch.

Fresh fruit is also available and freshly baked muffins can be purchased over the counter.

As well as the ordering system, children can buy items over the counter at recess and lunch.

Bus Timetable 2018

An amended bus timetable effective from 26 February has been published and is available on our website under School Notes as well as being available on our Skoolbag App.

Route 3508 has been added to the advice to assist with the high loads on 3725.

Students must have a valid Opal card to travel on school buses, and must tap on and off morning and afternoon.

5 Red News

What a wonderful start to 2018 we have had in 5 Red and hats of to the children for the smooth transition into the upper grades of St Michael's. The focus in our classroom has been 'Challenge'. We have been challenging ourselves to be the best we can be in all areas of our schooling and the way we present ourselves to the school community. The children are beginning to acknowledge when they are finding themselves in the "Comfort Zone" and looking for ways to find challenge.



We began the year by challenging ourselves to be creative thinkers and team players by taking part in a few problem solving activities that require the children to think outside the box, work collaboratively and reflect on mistakes.

One activity was the "Marshmallow Challenge" <u>https://www.ted.com/talks/tom_wujec_build_a_tower</u> where some groups had success. While other groups tasted disappointed and reflected on their process and how they could make it better next time.





In Mathematics, we have begun exploring Place Value and the magnitude of the numbers that we are working with. To begin the unit we explored a 'Million' and the children were challenged to find out how long it would take to count to one million. The thinking that the children demonstrated was quite impressive but the perseverance they showed when encountering difficulties was wonderful.

Georgia-Marie Barakat showed her working beautifully and came to the conclusion that one million is "an incredibly large number".

We have continued challenging ourselves when exploring Place Value by completing open ended tasks that are designed to allow the kids to push themselves as far as they want. Jay Puglisi was able to find two numbers that, when multiplied together, equal 36000. To challenge himself, he made one of the numbers a decimal.

Morning routine at St Michael's

In order for the children to develop their social skills, independence and confidence we ask that when you bring your child to the school playground that you give them a hug/kiss and leave the grounds as soon as possible.

Morning supervision commences at 8.20 am.

This play time in the morning gives the children opportunity to socialise, make friends and play their ball games with each other. **Please give them this experience and build their confidence by leaving the grounds once you have said your goodbyes**. Please do not join in their ball games as some children are getting upset that their parent is not there / cannot join in.

For safety reasons, please say all your goodbyes to your children on the playground and do not go up the stairs with toddlers or assist your child in carrying their school bag.

We also request that parents do not go to classrooms without an appointment. If you need to speak with a teacher, please leave a message at the school office or send in via email. These messages are forwarded to teachers and they will get back to you as soon as they can. We want all the children to feel St Michael's is a happy and safe place. These small steps in establishing routine can help us all build the children's independence. We thank you for your understanding and support.



Busways School Bus Safety Program

During the past week, all of our children (K-6) were introduced to the Busways' school Bus Safety Program teaching children to become school bus safety heroes.

David, our Bus Safety Trainer, spoke to the students about how to travel safely on the bus. The students then boarded a bus where safety messages were reinforced in practice, building their confidence to travel on a bus.

On completion of the session each child was given a School bus Safety Hero Pack including: a library bag, activity book with safety games, safety heroes stickers, a certificate and a Busways cardboard bus.

Please see the brochure in the pack with the safety messages listed that were discussed and ways "Parents can Help".

How Parents Can Help

- Hold your child's hand and walk together to the bus stop or bus interchange in the morning.
- Wait as far from the passing traffic as possible at the bus stop.
- If you cannot be with your child, organise for another trusted adult to take your place.
- Meet your child at the bus stop or bus interchange after school.
- Never wait on the opposite side of the road for your child; wait on the side the bus stops.
- Talk with your child about what to do:
 - \Rightarrow if you are delayed or can't meet them as usual
 - \Rightarrow if they catch the wrong bus
 - \Rightarrow if they get off the bus at the wrong stop

Be Careful at Bus Stops

When collecting children from bus stops it is very important for parents to wait on the correct side of the road – the side that the bus stops.

Students may become excited or distracted when seeing their parents after school which can cause them to forget or disregard safety rules and run out from behind or in front of the bus without looking.

This creates an extremely dangerous situation for your child and other motorists on the road. The majority of student related road accidents happen around bus stops after a child has left the bus.

Busways' school bus safety program aims to raise every student's ability to utilise buses and public transport in a safe and reliable manner. This is best achieved in partnership with parents and caregivers talking about and practising safety messages with their children.

Please practice school bus safety with your child.


