Reflection

There is a huge amount of research data that states that when parents are involved in their children's education at home, their children perform better at school. This performance is further enhanced if there is a good relationship between teacher and parent based on mutual respect and trust.

The principle criterion for parents to have a positive effect on their **child's attitude** towards learning is not the level of the parent's income nor the level of education, nor employment status nor language ability, it is the **parent's attitude** towards learning. Probably, there is every variety of difficulty experienced by a parent when it comes to being involved in a child's education. However, a parent can show how much they value education by taking an active interest in what's happening with their child.

A parent's positive attitude towards learning could be expressed by providing a quiet area for homework, by limiting TV, computer games and mobiles on school nights and by talking about what's happening at school.

A group called the "Children's Society" claims that too many parents have lost the art of play and do not allow their children's imaginations to be fully expressed. Children's play is often too "stage-managed" and "rule-bound" for children to really enjoy; parents are encouraged to loosen the reins and allow children to have more time to run free. When surveyed, children complained that their parents are too tired or too busy, are no fun because they are too bossy or have forgotten how to play.

An article that first appeared in the London Times contained this paragraph:

"Play is most important because it's how children enjoy their lives. They learn about rules, sharing, taking turns, community and all those social behaviours tat make us rounded people. It's about relationships. Play with a parent is just as much about relationships and trust. If a family doesn't play well together, communication and security suffer. No one ever grows old regretting the time they spent playing with their children."

Of course, play is not only about getting off the couch and onto the floor for, as children grow and mature, play becomes more sophisticated; but whatever its shape or form, parents should be important participants.

God our Father, As we go about our life today may Your Spirit go with us.

Help us in our efforts to be participants in the lives of our children

In ways that are helpful to their development as persons made in your image and likeness. Amen.

SCHOOL OPAL CARDS—Bus students

Bus inspectors are currently inspecting students' Opal Cards.

Busways have advised that Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't tap on and tap off, services may be cancelled due to the lack of recorded patronage.

Your child's teacher will not be able to talk to you during school hours as they are teaching or may be on duty at recess, lunch, before or after school. Your child's teacher will get in touch with you as soon as they can.

Opening a School Canteen Account

Opening a school canteen account works in credit!

Some days, your child/children may need a refreshment such as a juice or even a frozen fruit ice block on a hot day, but most importantly, there may be a time your child forgets their lunch at home or you simply forgot, having a canteen account puts a parents worry at ease. If this happens, simply ring the school canteen and one of our lovely staff members will be happy to take your child's lunch order by simply adding it on your school canteen account!


Having a school canteen account is also a great idea for the little ones who may lose their loose change, so we think having a school canteen account is more simplified.

Once the credit runs low, an SMS or a note will be sent to you, to let you know its time to top up again!

All your child needs to do is go to the canteen, and let them know their name and class and their purchase will be subtracted off the account.

This school canteen account has been trialled in other schools in NSW and works well for parents and the school!

COMPLAINTS AND GRIEVANCES

Policy and Procedures

At St Michael's Primary School, Baulkham Hills, the dignity of each individual is valued and the rights and beliefs of all members of the community are respected. St Michael's follows the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Complaint Handling Policy and Procedures which is available from the school office and on the school website.

However, from time to time concerns may arise between different groups within the school community. At St Michael's we aim to attempt resolution as soon as any concerns arise.

Procedural Fairness

We endeavour to ensure that our student behaviour procedures and strategies allow for procedural fairness. We believe that procedural fairness is a basic right of all when dealing with school authorities. We apply the "right to an unbiased decision" and the "hearing rule".

The "right to an unbiased decision" includes the right to:

- impartiality in an investigation and decision making
- an absence of bias by a decision-maker

The "hearing rule" includes the right of the student against whom an allegation has been made to:

- know the allegations related to a specific matter and any other information which will be taken into account in considering the matter
- know the process by which the matter will be considered
- respond to the allegations
- know how to repair relationships and to "make things right"
- know how to seek a review of the decision made in response to the allegations.

In order to ensure procedural fairness, school staff need to be allowed to investigate and respond to matters in an appropriate manner. Parents must always communicate directly with the staff of the school when they have concerns about student behaviour, rather than approach individual students or parents with their concerns

Parents

Complaints or grievances pertaining to classroom issues or that relate to other children are to be dealt with by school personnel. It is not appropriate for parents to approach other children or other parents while on school premises to resolve issues.

The recommended procedure to be followed by parents is:

- The first point of contact is the child's class teacher. An appointment with the teacher should be made via the school
 office or directly with the teacher.
- If parents are not satisfied with the solutions offered or believe they have not been given a fair hearing, they are encouraged to make an appointment with either the Principal or Assistant Principal, to discuss the issue further.
- Parents are reminded that there are always two sides to every story and while it is important to listen to their own child, it is also just as important not to draw conclusions or make accusations until all the facts are known.
- Parents may also contact Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta for further discussion.
- All parties should aim to work towards a mutually agreeable solution to the grievance.

Students

The recommended procedure for students who have complaints or grievances is:

- If and when issues arise in the classroom, students are encouraged to speak to the class teacher in order to seek assistance in finding a resolution.
- Students encountering problems on the playground are asked to talk to the staff member on duty, who will then if necessary refer it to the class teacher or one of the school's Leadership team.
- Students may also speak to any other staff member regarding any issues.

Employees

The recommended procedure to follow is the procedure set out in the Diocesan "Complaint Handling Policy and Procedures."

Appeal

A person who is not satisfied the matter has been resolved appropriately may choose to appeal to the Principal of the school if the Principal has not been involved in investigating or examining the complaint, or is not the person named as the source of the grievance / complaint.

Alternatively an appeal may be made to the Director of Performance for the school who may be contacted at the CEDP.

For CEDP matters an appeal may be made to the Executive Director of Schools.

School Volunteers at St Michael's

In order to become a school volunteer at St Michael's Primary School, all parent / grandparent volunteers must complete a Diocese of Parramatta Child Protection Training Course and Undertaking.

Click on Enrol Now, go to Parent Involvement, click on Child Protection Course.

You will then be directed to the Catholic Education Office - Diocese of Parramatta website:

Complete Steps 1 and 2

- Step 1: Complete 'Building Child Safe Communities Undertaking for Volunteers' Form
- Step 2: Complete the online training module

Once you have successfully completed the training, an email will be sent to yourself and St Michael's for our records.

These steps need to be completed every two years.

Teachers will sent home a note regarding volunteering in the classroom. All volunteers will receive a Classroom Volunteer Handbook from their child's teacher..

Unfortunately if you offer to assist and have not completed all the volunteer requirements, you will not be able to assist until the volunteer requirements have been completed.

All volunteers need to sign in at the school office.

If you inform us with a Skoolbag notification or via email, you do not need to send in another note. Please ensure that if your child is absent for one day that the Away date and Finish date are the same. Finish date should always be the last day of the child's absence

*Please note—If you call the office you will still need to send a signed note listing the days absent and reason.

Taking leave for family holidays during the school term

Government regulations require you to seek leave approval from the school for holidays of 5 days or more prior to your journey. Contact the school office for an *Application for Extended Leave (L) - Travel Leave—From A.1.* This form is also available on our website under School Notes.

Travel leave 1-4 days—please send in a written note to the school prior to your leave.

Taking leave for the entertainment industry or an elite sporting event

Government regulations require you to seek an exemption from the school for all leave in the entertainment industry or elite sporting events. Contact the school office for an *Application for Exemption from Attendance at School (M) - Form 1.2.* This form is also available on our website.

Photographs taken at school

From time to time photographs may be taken of your child whilst they are at school. These photos may be used in school Newsletters, publications and the school website. They may also be used by Catholic Education, Parramatta Diocese in their publications and website.
