#### From the Principal

**Dear Parents** 

#### Shakespeare Rocks Musical—19 & 20 August

Thank you to our dedicated and hard working staff for providing the students at St Michael's to have the opportunity to experience participating in a musical. Shakespeare Rocks will be performed on Monday and Tuesday evening. The children are to be congratulated for their hard work and commitment, and we look forward to a night of entertainment . . . A treasured memory of their time as a student at St Michael's school.

#### Teach your child to be punctual

Attendance and punctuality play a huge role in increasing children's academic success. When students are not in class they miss out on a wealth of knowledge as well as continuity of learning. When students miss school for no good reason, they usually lack the motivation to complete the work they missed from being absent. Having children practise punctuality at school is great preparation for their future careers, where showing up at work on time will not only make them dependable, but will also help them earn a living.

The best teaching is done by example.

- Give your children natural consequences that show them the results of lateness. Consequences prepare your children for the
  real world, where they really do miss out on learning, opportunities and even wages because they did not show up on time or at
  all.
- Teach your child that good attendance is not something that just happens. It takes planning, preparation and persistence, but it pays off. Ensure that your child will reap the rewards by instilling punctuality.

#### The Feast of the Assumption of Mary into Heaven

Every country in the world has its own shrines or chapels or churches, which give emphasis to the influence of Mary on the lives of the local people. Many Christians regard Mary as the female gateway through which they experience the divine.

I see the Blessed Virgin not only as Mother of God, but as a leader because she was a strong woman, she was a faithful believer, she lost her own son and for me she is a model of a very strong person and for this I admire her.

I am a mother, therefore, I can identify with her. For me, Mary is the feeling, compassionate mother; the all-embracing mother. I have the experience of having children; in that way I connect with Mary.

It would seem that Mary is a sign of hope and comfort to all Christians who, as God's pilgrim people, make our journey through life. Mary offers us a calm vision as we are tested by our own personal limitations, the circumstances that life presents to each of us and the sense of uncertainty with which our own mortality challenges us. Mary, through her life, shows us how hope can overcome anguish, inner peace can overcome anxiety and a life lived in a positive manner can overcome the fear of death.

The Assumption of Mary recognises the unique position of her being a superlative human person, who was taken body and soul to heaven. In some way, Mary's Assumption makes her a "hero" figure for us, her fellow human beings, because she was a participant in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christ followers.

The first time Jesus and Mary are mentioned together as adults, is at the Marriage Feast of Cana. When the hosts risked the embarrassment of a shortage of wine, Mary approached the "hospitality workers" and said to them of her Son, "Do as He tells you." This advice was timeless for it can be applied to all Christians in every day and age: love god, love your neighbour, love yourself; be people of compassion and forgiveness. Of course, this requires us to be in imitation of Mary when, at the Annunciation, her "yes" was the beginning of allowing God into her life. If we join with Mary's "yes", we give ourselves the opportunity, as she did, to be perfected through our union with Christ.

Mary, we ask you to help us to find peace within ourselves through your Son, Jesus.

Through your intercession, may we be inspired to greater trust and hope in our ability to live our lives, as you did yours, and to bring Christ to the world. Amen.



These steps need to be completed every two years.

Teachers will sent home a note regarding volunteering in the classroom. All volunteers will receive a Classroom Volunteer Handbook from their child's teacher.

#### News from 5K Blue—Mrs Kevill

Year 5 have been looking at animal habitats.

Our study started with an examination of the earth's climatic regions where we investigated how living things adapt to their environment. We then researched an animal of our choice looking at behavioural, physical and structural adaptations.

To further our investigation we read the book Emu by Claire Saxby and using this book as a model we produced our own book based on our research on an animal of our choice. This included a fictitious story about the animal with corresponding factual information. The next step was to use this research and writing to design our own animal showing how it could adapt to a given environment.

We produced a model of the animal and its environment, an information report and an infographic highlighting the structural, physical and behavioural features of the animal.

Our final task was to read our own story book to Year 2 which was enjoyed by both classes. It was an interesting learning journey with so many tasks covering literacy, science, technology, art and social skills.


