Doing yourself proud

There are times when you are going to do well, and times when you're going to fail. But neither the doing well, nor the failure is the true measure of success. The measure of success is what you think about what you've done. Let me put that another way: The way to be happy is to like yourself and the way to like yourself is to do the things that make you proud of yourself.

No matter where you go, there *you* **are.** The person who you're most with most in life is yourself and no matter how your circumstances may change, you are you, and you alone decide what you are going to do with the hand you are dealt.

In 1859 the Great Blondin – the man who invented the high wire act – announced to the world that he intended to cross Niagara Falls on a tightrope. 5000 people gathered to watch. Halfway across, Blondin suddenly stopped, steadied himself, back flipped into the air, landed squarely on the rope then continued safely to the other side. During that year, Blondin crossed the Falls again and again – once blindfolded, once carrying a stove, once in chains, and once on a bicycle.

Just as he was about to begin yet another crossing, this time pushing a wheelbarrow, he turned to the crowd and shouted "Who believes that I can cross pushing this wheelbarrow?" Every hand in the crowd went up. Blondin pointed at one man.

"Do you believe that I can do it?" he asked. "Yes, I believe you can," said the man. "Are you certain?" said Blondin. "Yes," said the man. "Absolutely certain?" "Yes, absolutely certain." "Thank you," said Blondin, "then, sir, get into the wheelbarrow."

Like that man in the crowd, you are sure about a lot of things. But also, like that man, there will be times in your life when being sure won't be as important as rising to the challenge. When that happens you'll have to decide whether or not to get into the wheelbarrow.

Overcoming fear is often no more than having faith in yourself. That is what a good education does for you. You learn to try, you learn to overcome difficulties and you learn that one success leads to another. Each time you enjoy that success, you are able to be proud of yourself. Make this term the one when you will feel proud of how you have faced the challenges of new work and achieved success. Swallow your fears and get in that wheelbarrow! (Acknowledgement: Marc S Lewis)

Helping To Develop Your Child's Literacy Skills

Listening to your child read:

- ⇒ When reading together at home try to make the time relaxed, enjoyable and positive. Vary it. Read together, read to your child and take turns or have them read to you.
- \Rightarrow Before reading, talk about the cover, the title and the pictures, and discuss what you think the book may be about.
- \Rightarrow Make sure your child can see the pictures and discuss them.
- \Rightarrow During reading, discuss what has been read so far and predict what might happen next.
- \Rightarrow After reading, talk and ask questions about the story and the pictures.
- \Rightarrow Ask who, when, where, how and why questions.

Reading Tips


⇒ When your child is reading and encounters words that are difficult for them, use the Three Ps technique 'Pause, Prompt, Praise' to support them.

\Rightarrow Pause:

- * When your child comes to a word they don't know, try not to jump in straight away. Wait and give your child time to work out the word.
- \Rightarrow Prompt:
 - * If your child has not worked out the problem word, prompt them.
 - * For example: Look at the sound the word begins with, look at the pictures, use these clues and think about what makes sense here.
 - * If prompts like these are not working, simply tell your child the correct word.
 - Try not to spend too much time prompting, as your child will find it difficult to maintain the overall meaning of what they are reading.
- \Rightarrow Praise:
 - * Praise your child's reading efforts and successes!

Writing

 \Rightarrow Children need to understand that writing has a purpose.



- \Rightarrow Compile a photo album or scrapbook with your child and have them write captions for the photos and pictures.
- ⇒ To develop vocabulary for reading and writing, play word games such as 'I spy", Scrabble, Boggle, Scattergories and do crossword puzzles.

2020 School travel applications now open

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/</u> updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.





ST MICHAEL'S BAULKHAM HILLS - ALLERGY - NUT AWARENESS

Throughout our school we have a number of children with **life threatening allergies** (Anaphylaxis) to various forms of food, latex, dust, cats and insect stings. This is a serious matter, one that our school must address.

Some children have allergies that are so severe that smells or touch could trigger a reaction.

In order to do this we appeal to all parents to assist us in caring for these children by considering the type of foods you pack for your own child's recess and lunch.

Our aim is to eliminate peanut and tree nut products brought into the school. These foods are extremely dangerous to our children with allergies and cause 50% of food allergic deaths.

Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask you to be 'nut aware' and refrain from sending them to school and to seek suitable alternatives.

The Canteen does not sell any of these products.

In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

There are many foods that DO NOT contain peanuts or nuts in their ingredients list, but the food package has the statement. "May contain traces of dairy, nut or seed". This food may be brought to school and consumed only by non-allergic children.

Due to safety and concerns, we discourage children from sharing food and drink. We would also appreciate parents speaking to their children regarding this matter. Your child's diet at home need not change.

Below is a list of foods that are safe for you to choose from. We're sure you can think of many others.

- Fruit and vegetables
- Dried fruits, Fruit snack packs
- Vegemite, jam, honey, cheese spreads
- Parker's Pretzels, Rice crackers
- Chips, Popcorn
- Plain biscuits sweet or savoury without nuts
- Chocolate biscuits without nuts
- Plain Cornflakes, Rice Bubbles, Weetbix, etc without nuts
- Fruit based muesli bars and snack bars without nuts
- Yoghurt without nuts mixes
- Lollies and confectionary items marshmallow, spearmint leaves, jelly babies, snakes, raspberries, etc without nuts.

Basically we ask you not to send food to school with your child that contains a nut or nut product listed in ingredients. We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all children at St Michael's.

TERM 1 2020 SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

For children 7 or 8 years of age or older who have not received the Sacrament of Penance. Children must be 7.5 years before the celebration. Policy and Procedures

At St Michael's Primary School, Baulkham Hills, the dignity of each individual is valued and the rights and beliefs of all members of the community are respected. St Michael's follows the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Complaint Handling Policy and Procedures which is available from the school office and on the school website.

However, from time to time concerns may arise between different groups within the school community. At St Michael's we aim to attempt resolution as soon as any concerns arise.

Procedural Fairness

We endeavour to ensure that our student behaviour procedures and strategies allow for procedural fairness. We believe that procedural fairness is a basic right of all when dealing with school authorities. We apply the "right to an unbiased decision" and the "hearing rule".

The "right to an unbiased decision" includes the right to:

- impartiality in an investigation and decision making
- an absence of bias by a decision-maker

The "hearing rule" includes the right of the student against whom an allegation has been made to:

- know the allegations related to a specific matter and any other information which will be taken into account in considering the matter
- know the process by which the matter will be considered
- respond to the allegations
- know how to repair relationships and to "make things right"
- know how to seek a review of the decision made in response to the allegations.

In order to ensure procedural fairness, school staff need to be allowed to investigate and respond to matters in an appropriate manner. Parents must always communicate directly with the staff of the school when they have concerns about student behaviour, rather than approach individual students or parents with their concerns

Parents

Complaints or grievances pertaining to classroom issues or that relate to other children are to be dealt with by school personnel. It is not appropriate for parents to approach other children or other parents while on school premises to resolve issues.

The recommended procedure to be followed by parents is:

- The first point of contact is the child's class teacher. An appointment with the teacher should be made via the school office or directly with the teacher.
- If parents are not satisfied with the solutions offered or believe they have not been given a fair hearing, they are encouraged to make an appointment with either the Principal or Assistant Principal, to discuss the issue further.
- Parents are reminded that there are always two sides to every story and while it is important to listen to their own child, it is also just as important not to draw conclusions or make accusations until all the facts are known.
- Parents may also contact Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta for further discussion.
- All parties should aim to work towards a mutually agreeable solution to the grievance.

Students

The recommended procedure for students who have complaints or grievances is:

- If and when issues arise in the classroom, students are encouraged to speak to the class teacher in order to seek assistance in finding a resolution.
- Students encountering problems on the playground are asked to talk to the staff member on duty, who will then if
 necessary refer it to the class teacher or one of the school's Leadership team.
- Students may also speak to any other staff member regarding any issues.

Employees

The recommended procedure to follow is the procedure set out in the Diocesan "Complaint Handling Policy and Procedures."

Appeal

A person who is not satisfied the matter has been resolved appropriately may choose to appeal to the Principal of the school if the Principal has not been involved in investigating or examining the complaint, or is not the person named as the source of the grievance / complaint.

Alternatively an appeal may be made to the Director of Performance for the school who may be contacted at the CEDP.

For CEDP matters an appeal may be made to the Executive Director of Schools.
