MAIs will be completed on Tuesday 28 & Wednesday 29 January 2020. A letter with the details for booking assessments will be sent home to parents with children in Years 1-6. Bookings will be done through the school interview website and will open on Thursday 19 December at 9.00 am. Please book an assessment time for your child with the 2020 class teacher. There are only a limited number of bookings on these days, so if you are not available or there are no interview times left, the class teacher will organise the assessment in the first two weeks of the 2020 school year.

2020 Kindergarten parents will receive a separate letter with a different booking code informing them of which teacher to book the interview with.

To access your child's ICAS reports online:

1. Visit the website homepage

- 2. At the top of the homepage, click on the **Results and Reports Portal**
- Click on the Sign in under Student Results tab half way down the page
- At the Student Result Login, enter your (student's) ten digit TAP-ID by you (student's) four digit PIN and then click Sign in. You will find your child's TAP-ID on the back of your child's ICAS certificate.

Bus Timetable Changes - Effective Monday 9 December

There have been further changes to the school bus advice sheet for Hillsbus services commencing 09 December 2019

Route 2033 has been withdrawn

Hillsbus have found that there has been a significant decline in OPAL card use on school buses due to students not tapping on and tapping off. Services are provided based on the need and are validated predominantly using OPAL.

We need to support the use of the OPAL card by our students on the bus.

Hillbus will be trialling a change in the way the students board school special buses which pickup students from the school and route service buses which pick up adjacent to the school. The proposal is to allow priority boarding for students with OPAL cards.

Can you please ensure that your child travels with their OPAL card every day and please speak to them about tapping on and off every trip.

News from Year 4

Excursion reports - Experiment Farm and Old Government House, and Kurnell National Park Botany Bay

In the past few weeks, Year 4 has been on two excursions to help us learn about the first contacts between the two colonies. We went on these excursions to help us with our project based learning program, on the history unit about the first contacts. The question that we are asked to answer is; The Colonisation of Australia had no negative impact on the Aboriginal and Torres Strait islanders, Prove or Disprove this! In both excursions we experienced what life was like in the first colony and in the fleets.

On the first excursion we went to Old Government House and Experiment Farm. At Experiment Farm we split into groups, and we did four different activities. They were: planting corn seeds; going into a cellar and learning what it was used for and what was in it; we had a house tour and went inside Surgeon John Harris' office where he made medicines and took care of the patient; and after that we went into his garden and learnt about the plants he used to make medicines.


We eventually left Experiment Farm to go to Old Government House. There we experienced what school was like in the early settlement. 4 Red and 4 Blue had Mrs Johnson as their teacher, while 4 Green and 4 Yellow had Mr Richardson. Both teachers addressed **our** parent helpers and teachers as big children. We learnt about the punishments and how they were taught in the early settlement.

We explored the inside of Old Government House at Parramatta Park. We learnt about the men and women and the differences and similarities between their lives and ours. We learnt about the servants, their jobs and the bells around the house that indicated each room and helped the servants know if someone needed assistants. We got to learn about the Aboriginals and how they dealt with the contact between the Europeans and we learnt about them on the ship.

Then a week later, the whole of Year 4 went on another excursion. We went to Kurnell National Park Botany Bay. There we went into three groups and did different activities including going on a bush walk and learning about the plants used and how they used them for the particular reason. Next we got to answer questions about the first fleet in a relay. Then we went on a coastal walk, learning about where James Cook first stepped foot onto Australia, where he got his first drink. Some people dressed up in costumes and acted out what that person did in 1788. Then finally the whole of Year 4 came together and split into groups of 3-4 to make gunyas against a tree using bark, sticks, rocks and leaves.

Year 4 enjoyed both excursions to Parramatta and Botany Bay. Both excursions are helping us improve in **our project based learning program.** Our favourite thing we did at Experiment Farm was doing a plant discovery activity in John Harris' garden. Our favourite discovery we did at Old Government House was going to school. Then finally our favourite thing we did at Kurnell National Park Botany Bay was the making of the gunyas.

News from Year 6

Year 6 have been busy this term creating and researching the different types of housing throughout the world.

It has been very exciting and a little nerve wracking to share our work with so many people and we hope that everyone enjoyed it.



Student Absence

Just a reminder to contact the school if your child will be absent at the beginning of the new school year.

The following outlines the Education Act 1990 requirements relating to attendance.

Requirements for student absence and travel

- 1-4 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written).
- 5-100 days absence: Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form (A1) prior to commencing leave. If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave (C1). If the principal declines this application (i.e. it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

Exemption from attendance

This now relates to students who wish to participate in an accredited Elite Sports Program/Elite Arts Program. This can also apply to Employment in the Entertainment Industry.

- If the intended absence will be under 100 days, parents should complete and submit the Exemption from Attendance (A2) to the principal. The principal has the authority to approve up to 100 days each calendar year. If approved the principal will issue a Certificate of Approval.
- If the intended absence will be over 100 days, parents must complete and submit the Exemption from Attendance (A2) to
 the principal who will make a recommendation to the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) Director System
 Performance (DSP). The DSP will then investigate the matter and will make a recommendation to the Executive Director.
 The Executive Director reviews the Exemption from Attendance and forwards a recommendation to the Minister of
 Education. If this application is approved the principal, will issue a Certificate of Approval (C2). Should this application be
 declined by the Minister, the principal will issue a letter of decline.
- For additional information on accredited Elite Sport Program and Elite Arts program, contact the school office.

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance in accordance with common codes which explain absences.

Car park

We have had a couple of incidents in the car park recently and need to remind everyone who uses the car park - drivers and pedestrians to take care and always be on the look out for pedestrians and other car users.
